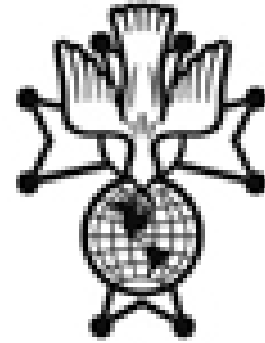
Chaplain's Column

I'd like to share with you a recent email I received from Jon Brunner, a member of our council deployed in Iraq. You can email him yourself at jon.brunner@us.army.mil

John,

I have moved since the last email. I am now in Northern Iraq, working with the Iraqi Army. It is very interesting and relatively safe, no bombs near here. Lynn did tell me about the recognition, thank you very much. The weather has been consistently warm but the mornings are nice for running. The AC works and we have ice cream still. It is amazing to see the spirit and attitude of these Kurdish people. They have attacked and oppressed by Saddam's regime for decades and they are, by far, farther along in terms of recovery and self sustainment. They have new construction going in, homes being rebuilt and business' growing. They are setting an excellent example for the entire country. It is an honor to be working with them.

Please share the email address with the members. Also, please look at the Iraqi children's action network (ican), it seems to be a good program for providing support to the Iraqi people. The battalion I am assigned to is helping to distribute supplies as they are sent in. I have enclosed some pictures, not to many solo shots of just me.

These are two others from my company, taken at the base in Saddam's hometown. The morale welfare and recreation (MWR) center is in a former palace. He spent a lot of money on his buildings and very little on his people. It is better for all the people, in this country and ours, that he is not here.

Congrats on the Venetian earnings. Lynn and Rachel ran in the race. It will be neat to see the new buildings at St John's. Barry, the officer on the left in the pictures lived for a couple of years in BH as a young child. Small world.
